Everyone who works with children has a responsibility for keeping them safe. No single practitioner can have a full picture of a child's needs and circumstances and, if children and families are to receive the right help at the right time, everyone who comes into contact with them has a role to play in identifying concerns, sharing information and taking prompt action (Working Together to Safeguard Children, 2018)

This course will provide organisations with an in house understanding of safeguarding and child protection procedures that are essential for all practitioners working with children and young people.

- Describe what children and young people want and need to feel safe.
- Demonstrate how values and attitudes can affect our responses.
- Identify how to report safeguarding concerns and the importance of information sharing.
- Identify laws and national guidance relating to safeguarding children.
- Define the criteria for levels of intervention and the role of the Early Help Assessment.
