Introduction

Specialist resourced provisions and ESTAs (Enhanced Specialist Teaching Arrangement) support pupils with significant special educational needs within mainstream schools.

This meeting is a termly opportunity for Teachers in charge or lead practitioners of specialist provisions in primary schools in Richmond or Kingston, to meet, share ideas and practice, and keep up to date with current issues regarding national and local initiatives. Other staff from specialist provisions are welcome to attend if the agenda seems appropriate. Teachers in charge have the opportunity to contribute to agendas and regularly share examples of effective practice. Regular events through the year include assessment moderation, good practice slots and local and national updates regarding SEN and disability legislation and local area and school Ofsted.

Meetings are hosted in schools to encourage sharing of practice and increase local understanding and knowledge of provisions. The meeting is facilitated by Sarah Herbert (Lead School Improvement Advisor SEND).
