



## Total Respect (Windsor and Maidenhead)

### Introduction

Article 12 of the United Nations Conventions for the Rights of the Child (UNCRC, 1989) says that young people have the right to participate in decision making that has a direct impact on their lives.

This is a training course delivered to professionals by members of our Children in Care Council, Kickback. The course is designed to energise and motivate staff, with plenty of activities to get you thinking about how children and young people experience being looked after and to learn from their experiences.

Total Respect Training is recommended for all staff working within Children's services including team managers and senior managers, service managers, service directors, elected members and councillors of RBWM as well as anyone with Corporate Parent responsibility or anyone working with children or young people in care. This training is also open to foster carers.

### Learning Outcomes

By the end of the session delegates will be able to:

- Demonstrate a thorough understanding of children's rights, including the right to participation, and relevance to the delivery of child centred services;
- Explore assumptions about children and young people, listen to young people and the experience of being a child in care;
- Involve young people in our care in planning, policy development and effective advocacy.
