



Restorative Practice Facilitator Training Course (Windsor and Maidenhead)

Introduction

Restorative Practice is a highly effective approach used to address situations of conflict, build relationships and repair harm by enabling people to communicate effectively and positively. It can be used across a variety of settings, from working with families, in criminal justice, in schools, the workplace and care homes.

This course is for nominated colleagues in Operational area 2. This Restorative Practice Course is accredited by the Restorative Justice Council.

- Relate the values of restorative practice to your work role and draft a strategic implementation plan.
