Introduction

With increasing numbers of cases entering into the Public Law Outline (PLO) process and moving into care proceedings, it is essential that staff within Children's Services are equipped to confidently approach court work. This course is designed specifically for workers who may need to attend court as part of their duties to safeguard children, including giving evidence at contested hearings.

The session is ideal for staff who have never attended court, need to improve confidence or have not been for a significant period of time and want to brush up their skills.
